❖ Discussion about Friday evening

- Registration
 - Everything went smooth and easy for the regular attendees. Many of the new youth however were confused about what forms were needed and what to do. That, however, is the responsibility of the church's RE Advisor, as well as explaining what cons are to the new attendees. This has been mentioned to the churches that had a problem, and should be kept in mind in the future.
 - Apparently, about twenty or more unregistered adults and youth showed up. People. Please. Register or do not come unless you have contacted the tri-chairs and received approval.
- Opening circle
 - Managed to still stay short, concise, and understandable with a reasonable time of thirty minutes.
- Touch Groups
 - Strangely enough, it has just now really occurred to the YAC that the food isn't the only thing that needs the option of being gluten free. Touch Groups should have access to some gluten free candy for the youth that have such needs. Thanks to the fact the online half of registration covers dietary needs, we can know ahead of time if we need some gluten free candy and about how much.
 - The Touch Group schedule was looser than usual, which worked well for a more laid back kind of con like this, but we want to keep in mind for the busier, more chaotic cons, we need to stick closer to the schedule for the sake of order.
 - The number distribution needs to be checked to be sure it's more even since we wound up with a few small TGs again, but were well handled.
 - The usage of the same games for the longest times has been brought up by various senior con attendees. It would be appreciated if everyone could keep in mind that we could use a few new games and ice breakers, and we're going to be looking through the book, *Deep Fun*, for suggestions.

- Worship
 - Worship this con was a peaceful affair, again with good length that neither drug on and on nor cut off to quickly.
 - When we went outside for Saturday night Worship, it was difficult to hear the readings. This is run into occasionally and will just have to be kept in mind next con.

❖ Discussion about Saturday events

- Wake up was surprisingly, but not unpleasantly, calm this time around, actually being later than most cons and it was fairly easier to rouse the UU youth than it sometimes has been.
- Food Stuffs

- Spirit Circle
 - All of YAC has come to the agreement that none of us know the songs completely anymore, thus need reviewing. Apparently they are in the book, **Deep Fun**, which every UU congregation has a copy of, so we can review them before next con hopefully.
- Workshops
 - Workshops were smooth sailing this con, except we had one or two people sign up to run about five different workshops with others. Please only go for two. The only other issue was the craft workshop left a mess that one of the youth ended up cleaning on their own. Thank you Allie.

- Surprise cleanup occurred just after lunch. It is asked that the senior higher and regular attendees guide the newcomers in what they're supposed to be cleaning up during the surprise clean up, since there was a little confusion on their part as to what exactly they were doing.
- TRA
 - There was some mixed response to the TRA, many claiming it was fun, enjoyable, and loose, but it fell apart after a while.
- Talent Show
 - This talent show wound up a little messy. Turns out the mike stand we usually use belongs to either Sully or Jack, since they usually bring one, so we're now looking into buying one for the YAC to transport to all the churches to avoid any issues like not having a mike stand. We improvised this time around, but it'd be preferable not to resort to that in the future.
 - The jokes used when MCing were the exact same from NeonCon and dragged on a little too much.
 - If anyone has any questions about if their act is suitable for a Jr. High Con, consult the tri-chairs for final confirmation. We had a small problem there.
 - The talent show was not made known to most people, despite it being announced once or twice. We need to try and spread it around more when the signup sheet is up.
- Dance
 - The volume was up a bit too loud, and as the dance was in the room just beneath the sanctuary, needs to be adjusted to such conditions from now on when they occur.
 - It was asked that the DJ please be polite to people who request during the dance, since a few complaints were heard.
 - A new variety was presented in the dance this con, which some enjoyed, some did not. It's all preference.
 - It has also been asked that songs are not repeated.
 - Again, there was a slight problem with the doors being opened to cool off. People, those stay shut, listen to us when we tell you this. Thank you. We're sorry that it gets all hot and sweaty, but curfew is curfew and the doors need to remain shut.

- Night Angeling
 - A reminder was issued that the YAC need to make sure night angels know to wake up the next shift. Again.
